Suicide Prevention in Schools

In the age of social media, live streaming, and constant news coverage; school administrators are forced to add "spokesman" to their resumes. Lawyer, journalist, public relations consultant, and now graduate level professor, Geri Dreiling has built her career helping law firms and other clients determine what to say, when to say it, and how to move forward after a crisis occurs. We will discuss how to identify a crisis, plan for it, communicate with different audiences, and how to put a crisis management plan into action.

When Volunteers Aren't Free

Parents, community members, PTOs, and even staff members frequently organize and participate in events or projects to benefit the school or your students. Whether it is building a concession stand, a charity fund raiser, or hosting a car wash, there is always the chance someone may be injured during the activity. The Awaken Project

The Awaken Project was founded several years ago by President, Joe Richardson formerly of the Boston Red Sox and his partner, Jeff Mozingo. The mission of this organization is to heighten the awareness of students, parents and staff on drug abuse and the heroin epidemic in our country and schools. The session has some staggering and personal information about the power of opioids and how quickly they become addictive and the many young lives lost to their power. These speakers reach out to our community and have spoken at 95 schools in 4 states in the past 3 years. Their mission is to educate kids in the risks involved, the power it holds, and offer alternatives to help our students make good choices.
